2. The polls must open at 6:00 a.m., but they can close any time after 6:45 p.m. that there is no one left in line to vote. True or False
3. Who is allowed to bring firearms into a precinct:
 - a. Any law-enforcement officer

 - c. Any person occupying his own private property that falls within 40 feet of a polling place

4. Poll watchers in the polling place may not:

13. While completing the Statement of Results, if there are more votes shown on the scanner than the number of voters who checked in on the pollbook:
- The pollbook records shall be closely examined and all EOs who operated the pollbooks shall be interrogated to determine where the error occurred.
 - The figures recorded by the scanner shall be accepted as correct.
 - A statement about this discrepancy shall be entered by the EOs in the space provided on the statement of results.

14. After determining the votes cast on scanners and paper ballots, all of the EOs shall verify that all required data has been accurately entered, sign both copies of the Statement of Results, and affirm that the statement is complete and the information thereon is true and correct. True or False
15. A voter who is marked on the pollbook as having received an absentee ballot who does not bring the absentee ballot with them to the precinct shall be allowed to vote normally on the scanner in the following circumstance:
- The chief uses their password to check them in and override the absentee notation on the pollbook
 - They are known to the chief or an EO as a person who would tell the truth
 - Under no circumstances unless their absentee ballot and envelope is verified as being returned
 - They are an outside polls voter
 - They complete the Attestation Form that their absentee ballot was destroyed or is unavailable
16. Voters who arrive at the polling place after 7:00 p.m. are allowed to vote if:
- They got in the line of voters outside the precinct before the last person in line entered the precinct
 - A court order has extended the polling place closing time and then they are only allowed to vote provisionally
 - The voter arrived before the pollbooks and scanner had been shut down
 - A and C only are correct
 - A, B, and C are correct
17. Voters who have been checked in and given a ballot must stay in the presence of EOs in the polling place until they have voted. True or False

18. When a voter is checked in at the pollbook, they can identify themselves by signing an ID Confirmation Statement unless they are marked as a HAVA voter then they must show either a photo ID or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows the name and address of the voter. If they do not, they are offered a provisional ballot. True or False

19. Under the law:
